



Presenting Risk Information - a half-day practical course

Overview

Understanding what risk information is important in your organisation, why this needs to be communicated and how to employ the best presentation approach.

What is covered?

The course will focus on three key elements:

WHAT? Assessing the key technical messages that you wish to present in your risk management reporting and briefing materials to ensure focused attention to the critical issues.

WHY? Understanding the essential aims of risk reporting - measuring risk status against appetite; reviewing loss trends; monitoring the cost of insurance and other risk mitigation practices; analysing the value of risk management; gaining support for risk reduction measures.

HOW? Presentation skills for risk managers - how to communicate well in different circumstances, ranging from one-to-one meetings, group discussions, boardroom briefings and lecture room presentations.

The take-away learning objectives for the morning are better planning for risk information presentation, an increased sense of purpose and an assessment of your current practices and areas for development.

Who should attend?

The course is suitable for all levels of staff working in a Risk Management function within an organisation who are (or may be) required to communicate risk identification activities and risk research.
